THE BOARD having examined and compared the Regimental Records, the Soldier's Book, and such other Documents as appeared to them to be necessary, report that No 695 Private Alexander Lindsay by Trade a Wearer was BORN in the Parish of Garnoch in or near the Town of Lanark in the County of Lanark and was ATTESTED for the 91st Regiment of Foot at Glasgow in the County of Lanark on the 8th February 1831 at the Age of 18¹/₂ Years that after making every Deduction required by Her Majesty's Regulations, the SERVICE up to this day, which he is entitled to reckon, amounts to 21 years, 92 days, as shewn by the detailed Statement on the 2nd page; during which period, he served Abroad 10¹/₂ years, viz.—

at St Helena 3 years, 10 Months
in Cape of Good Hope 7 years; 10 "
" Served during the Caffir War 1846 7 "

and further, that his DISCHARGE is proposed in consequence of Being Considered
